Caroline de Gruyter is Europe correspondent for the leading Dutch newspaper NRC Handelsblad. She is based in Vienna.

Between 2008 and 2013 she has lived and worked in Brussels, covering the euro crisis and European politics. In June 2013 she was awarded the prestigious Anne Vondeling Prize for political reporting. In November 2015 she received the Heldring Prize for best columnist for her weekly column *In Europe*. Her voice and expertise about Europe are well-known in The Netherlands.

Caroline is a regular contributor to Carnegie Europe and a member of the European Council on Foreign Relations. She was previously based in the Gaza strip, Jerusalem, Brussels (twice), and Geneva. She has written three books: *The Coffee House of Mohammed Skaik; Impressions from a Toy State Gaza* (1997); *The Europeans; Living and Working in the Capital of Europe* (2006); and *Swiss Lives; the New Political Reality in Europe* (2015).
